Tuesday 18th July

Walk Hougue de Vinde

La Hougue de Vinde is a circular monument, sometimes describe as a tumulus, and bearing similarities to the cist-in-circle series dated from the Late Neolithic to the Bronze Age (around 2850 to 2250 BCE). This site has recently been studied through an archaeological evaluation directed by Dr Helen Dawson (Freie Universität Berlin, Università di Bologna) and Dr Hervé Duval (Société Jersiaise Field Archaeologist) in the course of JICAS's Archaeological Summer School 2023.

The project aims a better understanding of the site and included a restoration work to preserve the monument for the future generations. The visit proposes to discover more about this archaeological site and explain the purposes of the research that is scheduled until 2025.

This iconic hillfort takes good care not to tell all its secrets, but is surely one of Jersey's most famous archaeological sites. The site offers a spectacular view, but why was it fortified in the past? Comparing this hillfort with other examples known on the Atlantic and Channel façade will also provide an insight of its potential. Threatened by marine erosion and global warming, the site of Le Rozel, delivers rare vestiges of the daily life of Neanderthal groups who occupied this remarkable point of the Normandy coast, about 80 000 years ago. Among these fragile remains, about 3,000 footprints have been unearthed by archaeologists: the largest collection of prehistoric footprints in the world. As the discoveries are made, the archaeological investigation takes us on a journey through time, in the footsteps of this other humanity that has now disappeared.

Directed by David Geoffroy, the film Neanderthal, in the steps of another humanity was released in 2022 and has since been winning international awards. The English version of the film will be displayed (Duration: 52 minutes), and David Geoffroy will be there to answer questions from the audience.

Saturday 29th July

Neolithic Neighbours – exploring the archaeological landscape at Faldouet

Earlier in year, we announced the launch of a Neolithic Landscapes Project which aims to research and study the landscape across Jersey in the Neolithic period some 4000 to 6500 years ago. From the visible remains in the form of dolmens and other megalithic structures, we know there was an active population who had adopted agriculture as their main source of food rather than the hunter - gatherer lifestyle which existed previously. We are asking neighbours who live close to these Neolithic megalithic structures to tell us if they have found any evidence in the form of artefacts from that period in their gardens. This event is a follow up for them and the public generally to join us for a short walk of exploration around where they live in order to explain what we know and what we think the landscape would have been all those years ago.
